- **35.** Do you agree that Estella was a victim of Miss Havisham's circumstances ظروف Why?
- Estella has been psychologically abused by Miss Havisham's upbringing when she used her to break men's hearts, which made her cruel, cold, and emotionless.
- **36.** Do you think that it's natural for criminals to be grateful? Why?
- Yes, some of them had to become criminals because of the circumstances they were brought up in. They would prove that they are good and productive citizens if they were given the chance.

- Yes, as she didn't tell him that she wasn't his benefactor.
- 39. Do you think Pip was happy to know who his real benefactor was? Why?
- No, he wished that Miss Havisham was his real benefactor so that he could marry Estella. Now that he knew his benefactor was a criminal, he wouldn't take any money from him.
- 40. Was it surprising that Miss Havisham felt sorry for Pip? Why?

- 44. Is there any similarity between Orlick and Provis? Why?
- No, they were like chalk and cheese: while Provis did his best to make a gentleman of Pip, Orlick tried hard to cause Pip as much trouble as he could.
- 45. In your opinion, what was the greatest expectation that was achieved for Pip?
- Changing his social status was the greatest expectation that was achieved for Pip as he finally became a manager in Mr Clarriker's business.
- 46. If you were Pip, what lesson would you learn in the end?
- One's happiness and well-being are not deeply connected to one's social position.
- 47. Should Havisham have forgotten what her fiancé had done and started a new life? Why?
- Yes, despite the bad experience she went through, she should have overcome it to lead a normal life: marry and have children.
- **48.** Which character do you sympathise with most in Great Expectations? Why?
- I sympathise with Miss Havisham because both her fiancé and brother had plotted to deceive her and take her money. This was too much to bear.
- **49.** In your opinion, which life was better for Pip: his life at the blacksmith's or the wealthy one in London with the convict's money? Why?
- Pip's life at the blacksmith's was better for him because he would be much happier living with the people who truly loved him.
- 50. Do you think Pip would have been happier if Miss Havisham had been his benefactor? Why?
- No, whether she was his real benefactor or not, Pip wouldn't marry Estella because she didn't love him and even if he had married her, she wouldn't have made him happy.
